A BILL

To amend the Financial Stability Act of 2010 to provide a criminal penalty for unauthorized disclosures of certain individually identifiable information by officers or employees of a Federal department or agency.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Prevention of Private
- 5 Information Dissemination Act of 2017".

- 3 Section 165 of the Financial Stability Act of 2010
- 4 (12 U.S.C. 5365) is amended by adding at the end the
- 5 following:
- 6 "(1) Criminal Penalty for Unauthorized Dis-
- 7 closures.—
- 8 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Any officer or employee of 9 a Federal department or agency, who by virtue of 10 such officer or employee's employment or official po-11 sition, has possession of, or access to, agency records 12 which contain individually identifiable information 13 submitted pursuant to the requirements of this sec-14 tion, the disclosure of which is prohibited by Federal 15 statute, rule, or regulation, and who knowing that 16 disclosure of the specific material is so prohibited, 17 willfully discloses the material in any manner to any 18 person or agency not entitled to receive it, shall be 19 guilty of a misdemeanor and fined not more than 20 \$5,000.
 - "(2) Obtaining records under false pretenses.—Any person who knowingly and willfully requests or obtains information described under paragraph (1) from a Federal department or agency under false pretenses shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and fined not more than \$5,000.

1 "(3) TREATMENT OF DETERMINATIONS.—For 2 purposes of this subsection, a determination made 3 under subsection (d) or (i) based on individually 4 identifiable information submitted pursuant to the 5 requirements of this section shall be deemed individ-6 ually identifiable information, the disclosure of which 7 is prohibited by Federal statute.".
