A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of Agriculture to publish, on an annual basis, an assessment on United States dependency on critical agricultural products or inputs from the People's Republic of China, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Securing American Ag-
- 5 riculture Act".

1SEC. 2. CRITICAL AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS OR INPUTS2STUDY.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Agriculture (in this section referred to as the "Secretary") shall, on an 4 5 annual basis, submit to the Committee on Agriculture of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Agri-6 7 culture, Nutrition, and Forestry of the Senate, an assess-8 ment of the dependency of the United States on critical 9 agricultural products or inputs that could be exploited in the event the People's Republic of China weaponizes any 10 11 such critical dependency.

12 (b) CONTENTS.—The assessment under subsection13 (a) shall—

14 (1) address, with respect to the critical inputs15 specified in subsection (c), the following:

16 (A) the current domestic production capac-17 ity of each such critical input; and

(B) the current and potential bottlenecks
in the supply chain for each such critical input
that could be exploited by the People's Republic
of China; and

(2) contain the Secretary's recommendations to
reduce the dependency of the United States on the
People's Republic of China to supply critical agricultural products or inputs, including—

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1	(A) recommendations to mitigate potential
2	threats posed by the People's Republic of China
3	to the supply chains of each critical input speci-
4	fied in subsection (c); and
5	(B) recommendations for legislative and
6	regulatory actions to reduce barriers to onshore
7	or nearshore the production of each such crit-
8	ical input.
9	(c) CRITICAL INPUTS.—The critical inputs specified
10	in this subsection shall include all farm management, ag-
11	ronomic, and field-applied production inputs, including
12	each of the following:
13	(1) Agricultural equipment, machinery, and
14	technology.
15	(2) Fuel.
16	(3) Fertilizers.
17	(4) Feed, including its components, such as vi-
18	tamins, amino acids, and minerals.
19	(5) Veterinary drugs and vaccines.
20	(6) Crop protection chemicals.
21	(7) Seed.
22	(8) Any other critical agricultural inputs, as de-
23	termined by the Secretary.
24	(d) Collection, Distribution, and Protection
25	of Information.—

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(1) VOLUNTARY BASIS.—In conducting an as sessment under subsection (a), the Secretary may
 not require any private entity to provide information
 to the Secretary.

5 (2) AGGREGATE DATA.—In the case of informa-6 tion provided to the Secretary to conduct an assess-7 ment under subsection (a), neither the Secretary, 8 any other officer or employee of the Department of 9 Agriculture or agency thereof, nor any other person 10 may—

(A) use such information for a purpose
other than the development or reporting of aggregate data in a manner such that the identity
of the person who supplied such information is
not discernible and is not material to the intended uses of such information; or

17 (B) disclose such information to the public,
18 unless such information has been transformed
19 into a statistical or aggregate form that does
20 not allow the identification of the person who
21 supplied particular information.

(3) CONFIDENTIALITY.—The Secretary shall
ensure that assessments submitted under subsection
(a) do not include any information that is a trade
secret or confidential information subject to section

- 552(b)(4) of title 5, United States Code, or section
 1905 of title 18, United States Code.
- 3 (4) IMMUNITY FROM DISCLOSURE.—Any infor4 mation provided to the Secretary as part of an as5 sessment conducted under subsection (a) may not be
 6 used by the Secretary for any purpose other than to
 7 carry out such subsection.
